As the weeks have become cooler our students have been offered chicken and veg soup with toast, veg and noodle soup with toast, chicken strog on a bed of brown rice, buttered chicken on a bed of brown rice, cheese toasted sandwiches, beef patties with different sauce and salad options.

When showing an appropriate voice level we need to find the appropriate voice level for the situation we are in:


Voice level basics
