Ruma Tupu Tuakana

Tupu Tuakana are focusing on Multiplication and Division this term. Part of our learning involves using what we know to work out what we don't know. Today we talked about problem solving and how to interpret information and write the equation to suit, e.g. There are 10 cows in the paddock, how many legs are there altogether? $10 \times 4 = 40$. The students then had to come up with their own problem/story and write the equation to go with it.

<h3>Multiplication & Division</h3> <p>I can solve multiplication and division problems using repeated addition or known addition facts. eg. $4 \times 6 = (6 + 6) + (6 + 6) = 12 + 12 = 24$</p> <p>I can solve multiplication and division problems using known simple multiplication facts or repeated halving. eg. $20 \div 4 = \square$ $1/2$ of $20 = 10$ and $1/2$ of $10 = 5$ so $4 \times 5 = 20$</p>  <p>I know x2, x5 and x10 multiplication facts and matching division facts.</p> <small>Reference: Ministry of Education (2008). Created by Julie Roberts, 2011.</small>	<h3>Multiplication & Division</h3> <p>I can solve multiplication and division problems by using known facts and mental strategies to derive the answers.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Place value $13 \times 5 = (10 \times 5) + (3 \times 5) = 65$Rounding and compensating $3 \times 18 = 3 \times 20 - 6$Doubling and halving $4 \times 8 = 2 \times 16 = 32$Reversibility $63 \div 9$ as $9 \times \square = 63$  <ul style="list-style-type: none">Using known facts 3×6 so $2 \times 6 + 6 = 18$Doubling 4×7 as $2 \times 7 = 14$ so $4 \times 7 = 28$Halving $36 \div 4$ as $1/2$ of $36 = 18$ and $1/2$ of $18 = 9$ <p>I know multiplication facts to x10 tables and some matching division facts.</p> <p>I know multiplication facts with tens, hundreds and thousands.</p> <small>Reference: Ministry of Education (2008).
