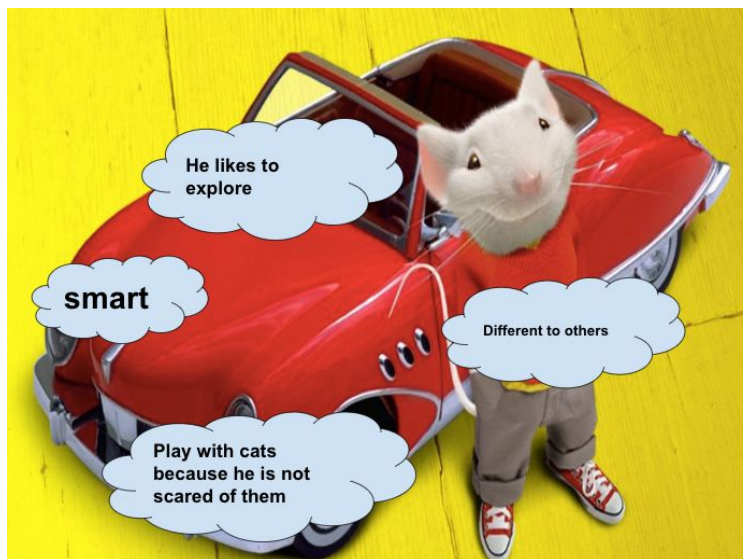
CAKE STALL

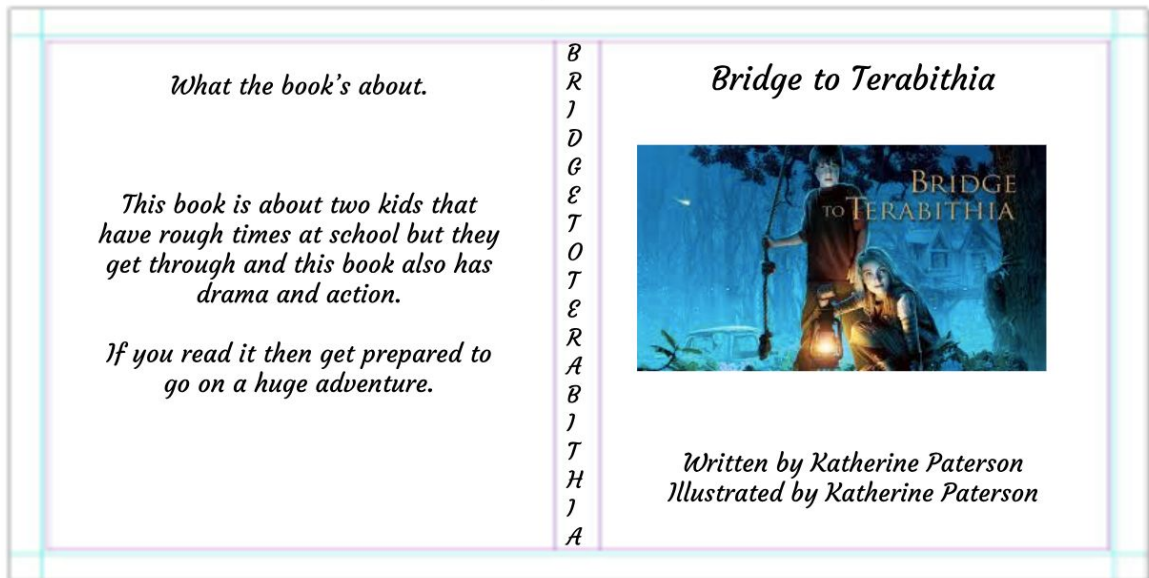
