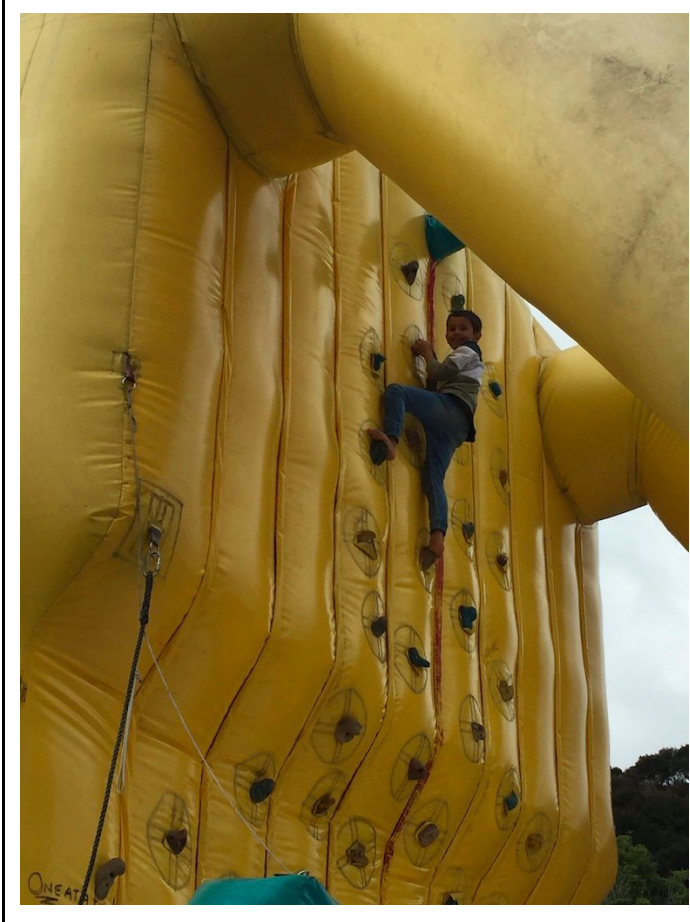

Te Manawa Tahī is a learning support hub where you can come in and talk to education professionals about your child's learning needs. This is a free service. Learning support have teamed up with schools/kura, early childhood, iwi and community providers to work together with the sole purpose of providing support for your tamariki and their learning needs. You can come into the hub without an appointment or you can call either 080052484256 or our school office to make an appointment.

Sea turtles live in the sea.


